




Week 3: September 9, 2022

Our first round of NWEA/MAP Testing kicks off next week. The NWEA MAP Test (Measures of Academic Progress) is an adaptive achievement and growth test. It creates a personalized assessment experience by adapting to each student's learning level—precisely measuring progress and growth for each individual student. If your child correctly answers a MAP question, the computer assessment provides a harder question next. If they miss that same question, then an easier MAP question is asked. This provides essential information about what your child knows and is ready to learn.

The MAP Test is published by the Northwest Evaluation Association (NWEA) and is given via computer to children in grades K-12. Its structure is cross-grade, which provides measurement of students who perform on, above, and below grade level. If your child has been with our school district in the past, they will be very familiar with this assessment.

Once we have completed our Fall Testing, students and staff will use their results to set learning goals and targets for the school year. Data results will be shared with families once our testing window closes.

Thank you for helping to facilitate this process by making sure that your child comes to school on time and prepared for testing!

Interested in the National Junior Honor Society?



You must:

- ★ be in 7th or 8th grade
- ★ maintain a 3.5 GPA or higher
- ★ have **no demerit points** on record with AP office after induction
 - ★ complete the <u>National Junior Honor Society</u> <u>Application</u> by November 1 2022

What is it? The National Junior Honor Society is a prestigious, invitation-only national organization. Being accepted into NJHS is a real accomplishment since being able to join means that a student has performed exceptionally well during their time in middle school. Students must qualify based on their personal attributes of character, scholarship, leadership, citizenship, and service.

How can I join? The Crete-Monee Middle School chapter of the National Junior Honor Society will hold its induction in the fall of 2022 after the first grading trimester ends. At that time, seventh and eighth grade students are eligible to be inducted. All interested students must:

- 1. have maintained a 3.5 GPA.
- 2. complete community service. Community service hours should be logged on the NJHS Community Service Hours Report form linked below.
- 3. be recommended by his/her teachers as a student of high character.
- 4. have no demerit points after acceptance into the organization.

Interested sixth and seventh graders: Complete and submit the <u>CMMS National Junior Honor Society Application</u> <u>2022/2023</u> Google form by November 1, 2022. Be sure to also complete at least 10 hours of community service, and record them on the <u>NJHS Community Service Hours Report 2022/2023</u>.

IMPORTANT REMINDERS:

- <u>ID's</u>: All students received a color coded ID and lanyard. It is the student's responsibility to wear both around their neck at all times during the school day and on our buses. Your account will automatically be charged \$5 every time a replacement ID/lanyard needs to be issued.
- <u>Clear Backpacks</u>: ALL students have received their school issued CLEAR Backpacks. <u>CMMS Backpack</u>
 <u>Expectations</u> were reviewed and all students received a physical copy as well.
- <u>Cell Phones</u>: All cell phones and non-school issued electronic devices need to be turned off and put away during the school day. Students who fail to adhere to this expectation will be subject to Board sanctioned consequences.
- **Chromebooks:** Students are expected to bring their charged chromebook daily.
- Health Office Forms: 6th graders & new to district students are required to submit a current state physical form at the start of the school year. If you took care of this over the summer, please send a copy of your documentation to Nurse Daniels. Need a form? Click here→ State Physical Form Please understand that if your documentation is not turned in by October 14th your child will be excluded (not allowed to attend) school starting on October 15th and will remain as an unexcused absence until the appropriate documentation is turned in. This is part of the IL State Code.
- <u>Water Bottles</u>: Students are welcome to bring their own refillable water bottles. We have bottle fillers located throughout the building. Please make sure your child's name is clearly written on their bottle.
- <u>Food Items</u>: There are set times for students to eat breakfast & lunch. Students are not permitted to "order" lunch to be delivered to the school. Parents, if you are dropping off lunch for your child, it needs to be in our office prior to the student's assigned lunch time.




