KEY REMINDERS:

- ID's: All students received a color coded ID and lanyard. It is the student's responsibility to wear both around their neck at all times during the school day and on our buses. Your account will automatically be charged \$5 every time a replacement ID/lanyard needs to be issued.
- Clear Backpacks: ALL students have received their school issued CLEAR Backpacks. CMMS Backpack
 Expectations were reviewed and all students received a physical copy as well. Every student has the same backpack, so to help with any confusion, we welcome your child individualizing their bag by adding a distinctive sticker or name tag to their backpack.

- 6th Grade & New Student Physicals: An updated physical and vaccination record needs to be submitted at the start of 6th Grade. Please understand that if your documentation is not turned in by Friday, October 13th your child will be excluded (not allowed to attend) school starting on Monday, October 16th and will remain as an unexcused absence until the appropriate documentation is turned in. 
